

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

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A Strategy for the Church Heritage



- 1. The Church Heritage should continue to belong to the community and be appreciated as a central source of enjoyment and understanding of the Norwegian history of ideas and society.
- 2. The church environment with the church building and church yard should remain open, accessible and in active use.

- 3. The heritage of Church of Norway should have a legal protection which reflects its national value.
- 4. The heritage of Church of Norway should have a public funding which makes it possible to maintain the heritage values in the long term and in a good way.

- 5. The Church of Norway shall take an active ownership of its history and material heritage, and increase its knowledge about the church heritage and communicate this knowledge.
- 6. The church environment with church building, church inventories, churchyard and other buildings and heritage should be kept and maintained in accordance with heritage principles that secures a continuous use.

- 7. The church should strengthen and organise its work on heritage in ways that secures high competence, unified protective policy, good processes and in cooperation with the ecclesiastical organs and public heritage authorities.
- 8. The dissemination of the heritage should be an integrated part of the service and rituals, faith education and church music.

9. The church should strengthen its competence on the church heritage of indigenous people and of national minorities.
