The number of listed English places of worship and breakdown by grade was provided by Historic England in January 2025, based on August 2021 data updated with July 2024 Heritage at Risk data. For the Roman Catholic Church, the figures depend on whether e.g. monasteries, convents and private chapels are included (here probably not). Wales. The breakdown of listed buildings by denomination for Wales is probably reliable (as at 2016). For the Church in Wales, the 'all POW' and 'total listed' are correct at January 2025; about 100 closed churches were at that time being prepared for sale or transfer to a third party. For the Roman Catholic Church, the figures are as at January 2025. The 'total' figures come from the 2015 Strategic Action Plan for Historic Places of Worship in Wales (Cadw), and we suspect are unreliable. Scotland. The figures for Scotland were provided by the National Churches Trust from its 2010 survey. In January 2025 the Church of Scotland possessed 1647 places of worship, of which 1161 were listed 16% of the listed churches (over 180) were listed Grade A. Northern Ireland. As known to HRBA in 2016. A later figure from the Department of Communitiies, precise date unknown, gives a total of 939 listed churches, 1 listed Hindu Temple, 1 listed synagogue.
